SOCIETY AND CULTURE OF THAILAND SUMMER

Go beyond sightseeing and gain a deeper understanding of Thailand by **learning directly from local communities**. This four-week study abroad program blends **academic coursework** with **hands-on experiential learning**, taking students beyond what a tourist or traveler would see. Based in the culturally rich city of Chiang Mai, this program explores Thai **society**, **history**, and **culture**, offering students an in-depth look at both **traditional** and **contemporary** Thailand.

Each week, students take part in **experiential learning** activities that bring classroom discussions to life. Whether it's **exploring** the ancient walled city of Chiang Mai, studying the **history of sacred temples**, learning about the **cultural significance of Thai street food**, or navigating the city's vibrant **markets** and **modern cafés**, these experiences provide a deeper connection to Thailand's people, culture, and way of life. Chiang Mai, a city where ancient traditions meet modern life, serves as the perfect backdrop for studying how Thailand **balances deep-rooted heritage with rapid change**.

What makes this program truly special is the opportunity to **engage with communities firsthand**. In addition to urban field studies and classroom discussions, students spend one weekend in a **homestay** with **Northern Thai villagers** practicing organic farming and another weekend in an **indigenous Karen village** high in the mountains. These immersive experiences offer a unique perspective on rural Thailand, indigenous cultures, and the ways communities balance tradition, sustainability, and modern challenges.

Academic Focus & Learning Outcomes

This program combines classroom learning with real-world experiences to deepen students' understanding of Thailand. Students will:

- Develop practical Thai language skills through structured lessons and daily interactions.
- Explore Chiang Mai's history, from its ancient temples to its modern creative scene.
- Examine the role of street food, markets, and cafés in Thai daily life and culture.
- Analyze the blend of ancient traditions and modern influences in urban and rural settings.
- Engage with local communities, artisans, and experts to gain first-hand insight into Thai society.

Through a combination of fieldwork, discussions, and immersive experiences, students will apply academic concepts in meaningful ways, gaining a valuable cross-cultural perspective of historical as well as contemporary Thai society.
